

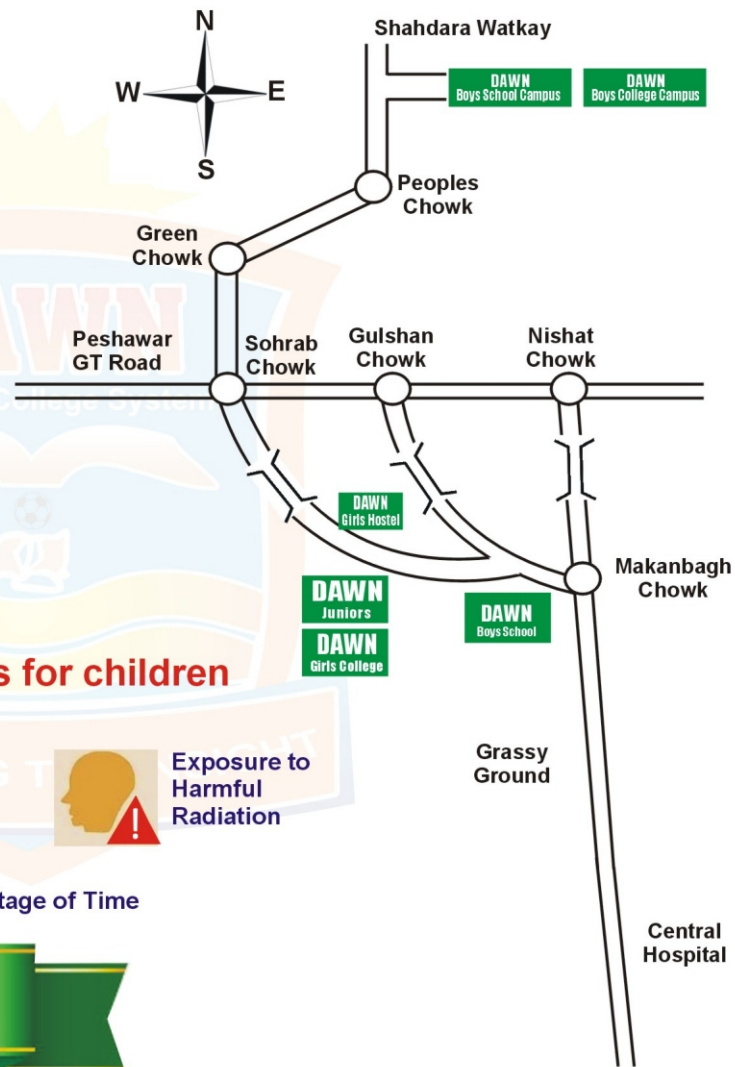

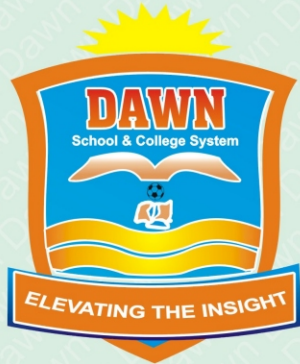

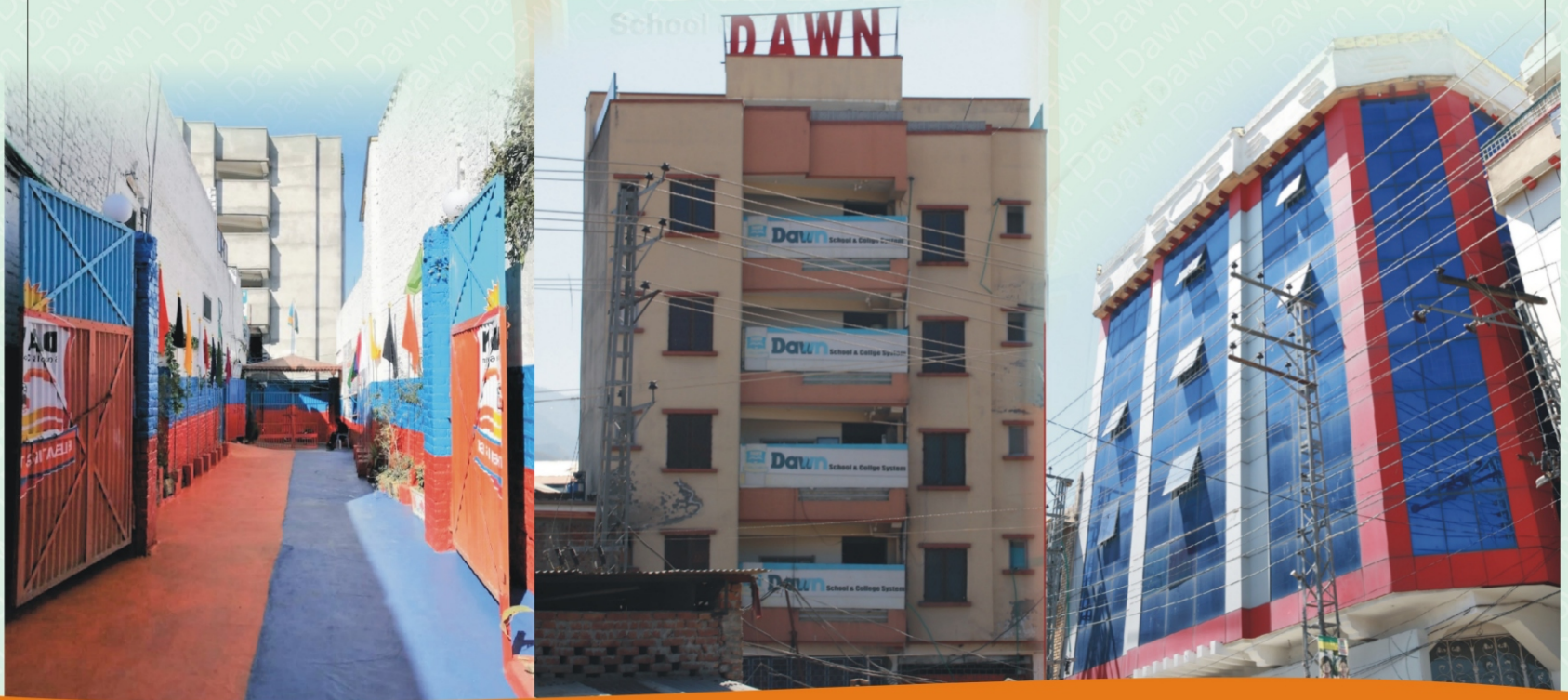

BOYS/GIRLS COLLEGES:

Faculty for this level has been split into two fragments.

1. MORNING:

2. EVENING:

RULES FOR ATTENDING CLASSES IN AFTERNOON SESSION

A student will be allowed to attend afternoon session if his/her parent / guardian has submitted a written request to the head of the institute showing his/her willingness and support to send his/her ward for the Afternoon Session & he/she has shown regular attendance in the Morning Session. Afternoon Session is necessary and is integral part of the academic process, but still subject to approval of the parent/guardian and governed by strict rules under the supervision of Trained Managers.



ADMINISTRATIVE

CHAIN OF COMMAND

The Dawn School & College System Swat has a broad based administration which is a cohesive network of competent professionals encompassing the following segments.

1. BOARD OF GOVERNORS (EX-OFFICIO)

It is an ex-officio body that exercises its powers through Special Assistant (SpA) to BOG, sets rules / regulation / policies to run the institute in close harmony with the opinions and expertise emanating from other think tanks especially advisory board, selection board and national as well as international centers of

2. ADVISORY BOARD:

This is a unique team of highly experienced professionals possessing vast knowledge in different fields of life. The board meets on quarterly basis. Important tasks assigned to this body are providing guidance in framing educational policies for the institute devises, approaches and methodologies. In a real sense, the board brings further refinement in the educational process through thorough result oriented discussions and assessment tools.

3. PRINCIPAL:

The Principal exercises delegated powers & is responsible within the domain of his duties to the Special Assistant (SpA) to BOG. The Main duty of the Principal is to run the senior section according to the charter of Dawn.

4. SELECTION BOARD:

This is the most important body comprising eminent professors, subject specialists possessing vast practical experience in different disciplines of knowledge, Administrative managers, Scholars, Retired Army and Civil officers. The board is entrusted with the task to select most suitable personnel for the most suitable job and make recommendations to the appointing authorities. To make the process of appointment more accurate, the services of psychologists have also been hired.

5. SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO BOG:

This office is the real centre of executive powers which exercises its power on behalf of the ex-officio BOG. The Special Assistant to BOG responsible for the implementation of all policies and controls the other departments of administration i.e. Principal, Section Heads, Coordinators, Wardens Boys Hostel and Warden Girls Hostel.



ADMINISTRATIVE

6. HUMAN RESOURCE DEPARTMENT (HRD)

A human resources department is a critical component of employee well-being in an organization. Human resource activities fall under the following five core functions: staffing, development, compensation, safety and health, and employee and labour relations. Within each of those core functions, HR conducts a wide variety of activities at DAWN, we have a separate Human Resource Department, which works day and night for the betterment of the employees.

7. PUBLIC RELATION OFFICER (PRO)

For convenience of all the information seekers, office of the PRO has been established. PRO provides all up to date information about the overall profiles of the institution and students. This office also works as a bridge between home and institute imparting timely information to all guardians at their door steps.

8. FINANCE & ACCOUNTS

Finance and accounts has a separate block, this office deals in accounts and finance of the institute, issuing prospectus, forms collection, students data collection and maintenance thereof.

9. DIRECTOR ACADEMICS CENTRAL ACADEMICS MONITOR (CAM)

Director Academics is an independent and transparent department holding all information related to staff members and Section Heads/Coordinators regarding how they are doing their assigned tasks. CAM is evaluating the standard of teaching-learning process and making graphs out received data (From ready-made questionnaires).

10. EXAMS SECTION

Being a body of qualified and competent faculty members, this section is headed by Controller of Exams (COE) and is an autonomous body that regularly conducts, organizes and manages exams/Tests etc.



ACADEMICS:

Main features of the academic arena characterizing Dawn School & College System are as below:

- Standard National Curriculum/Syllabus with some modifications is followed from Playgroup to Class 7th.
- From Class 8th to F. Sc., The syllabus approved by K.P. Text Book Board is followed.
- Much more diversified approach of teaching is followed at junior level including activities-based teaching, toys, well planned games, computer based learning, presentations, small projects, large screen video lessons all suitable to the needs of kids under well paid and highly skilled female teachers who have served in highly reputed institutes of the country.
- At junior level, each class is controlled by two female teachers simultaneously, the first teacher, being demonstrator, inculcate concepts whereas second teacher working as assistant, helping the students to refine their writing skills, maintain individual diary of the students and check home assignments.
- There is a well regulated curriculum panel entrusted with the task to ensure the efficient implementation of curricula at all levels.
- Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTM) are held on a regular basis with the aim to incorporate the inputs coming from homes & increase home participation in the learning process. Parents/Guardians are requested to take a special interest in the education process of their children and pay us physical visits regularly.
- At metric and F.Sc levels, the teaching program is split into two sessions, morning as well as afternoon. The afternoon session is regularly followed to enrich the academic strength of the students keeping in view the deficiencies as well as ease & comfort of students through out the year. **S.S.C & F.Sc courses in Dawn are completed 3 to 4 times a year which is a distinction of Dawn & cannot be found in any other institute of KP.**
- All the enrolled students at S.S.C and F.Sc. levels are compulsorily hostelized for the last three months of Academic Year after which they are taking their examinations.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

The following documents/testimonials must be attached with the admission form.

- ✍ Provisional Certificate/SLC & DMC of the last Examination passed.
- ✍ Character certificate from the last attended institute, duly signed by the head of institute concerned.
- ✍ Four latest passport size colored photographs
- ✍ Copy of father CNIC or Domicile of the Candidate
- ✍ Migration Certificate (if required).
- ✍ Affidavit completed in all aspects.
- ✍ Form “B”.

Note: All photocopies of the documents must be duly attested by a gazetted officer and these shall not be returned if admission is refused. The Parents/Guardians will have to sign the undertaking and will be responsible for his/her Son/Daughter/relative not to indulge in any political activity disobedience/misbehavior or do any thing which may interrupt normal functioning of the institution in any manner.

FEE STRUCTURE

- (i) In case of new admission, full year dues are charged in advance. Fee once paid is not refundable or adjustable for other purposes.
- (ii) The students are required to clear all their dues before term examination or asking for the school leaving certificate. It also include full fee for the month during which a request for the certificate has been made. .
- (iii) No concession/reduction in the fee/funds shall be allowed for any period of absence due to any reason.
- (iv) Fee structure can be revised from time to time by the authorities keeping in view the objective economic conditions of the country and financial challenges faced by the institute whenever the need for revision is felt. However only rational and justified increase in fee is favored by the Board of Managing Directors.



FEES SUBMISSION MODES:

1. **Lump Sum:** In case of Lump Sum payment on higher secondary level (F.Sc) 5% discount is given on annual tuition fee only. Admission fee, Registration fee etc are exclusive from 5% discount. Subject to the condition that the total amount is deposited with in due period given in fee challan. Fee deposited in lump sum after the due date given in fee challan will not entitle a student for any discount.
2. **Installments:** Allowance for installments fall in maximum three steps.
 - i) **First Installment:** 50% amount of the total tuition fee plus admission, security and all other fees.
 - ii) **Second Installment:** 25% amount after two months of the 1st installment. (Before 15th October of each year)
 - iii) **Third Installment:** Remaining 25% amount after two months of the 2nd installment. (Before 15th December of the same year).
3. **Bi-Monthly:** On Secondary level and Junior level tuition fee is deposited on bi-monthly installment basis as well as lump sum as stated above in clause 1. Details of fee structure for the current year can be seen on page # 15.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP FOR F.Sc STUDENTS ONLY:

A new policy of scholarships for highly followed students is in operation for each year (for Boys & Girls), with the objective to compete on provisional levels. Details of the policy are available in PRO office.



FEE REFUND / MIGRATION POLICY:

In case of leaving the institution, withdrawal or expulsion, admission fee and other fee in any case are not refundable. In case of withdrawal, one month prior notice in written must be given or one month fee shall be payable in lieu of notice. The candidates seeking withdrawal, migration or leaving the school/college for any reason, only the deposited tuition fee of remaining months of the session and security after deduction of fines etc will be refundable. Further more, the tuition fee of running month will be charged in full. Migration is not allowed for those who have availed scholarship facility of DAWN. Such students will be dealt according to the bond submitted by the students and guardians with DAWN at the time of admission.

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE POLICY

To ensure regular attendance of students, strict rules are followed. The institute reserves the right to drop a student from the final term / board examination who has less than 90% for scholarship students of the attendance (in each subject, theory & practical). A student is liable to be struck off from the College / School roll, if he/she remains absent for 05 consecutive days without authorized school leave or any cogent reason supported by valid documents. Re-admission may be allowed at the Head's discretion within seven days of his/her being struck-off on payment of prescribed fee and fine. After the lapse of 07 days, the student shall be struck off the rolls, He/she will have to readmit himself/herself within 15 days time span as no readmission will be possible after the laps of 15 days. Any kind of leave exceeding three days shall be granted only if the application is attested by parents / guardians. A warning notice against the student remaining absent for 06 consecutive days shall be displayed on the notice board and a struck off notice to the parents. Students may leave the School/College Temporarily or fully by a short leave on leave form, duly signed by the head of the section under special circumstances.

ASSESSMENTS AND EXAMINATIONS

- 1) Academic Session of school section begins from February to January each year. During one Academic Session of school Section, Monthly Tests, Term Examinations, Enrichment Tests/Board Warmup Examinations and a Pre-Board Examination are conducted. According to schedule mentioned in the Calendar of Events.
- 2) The Academic Session of the College section for F.Sc Part-I is from August to May while for F.Sc Part-II it is from June to May. During the Academic Session for F.Sc, Monthly Tests, Term Examinations, Enrichment Tests/Board Warmup Examinations and a Pre-Board Examination are conducted. The purpose of these tests / examinations is to prepare the students for Annual Board Examinations and Entry Tests for admission to Medical and Engineering Colleges/Universities as well as other professional institutions. The results of examinations/tests are conveyed to the Parents/Guardians through SMS and online generated students' software. All the Tests/Examinations are conducted and organized by the Controller of Examinations. Passing marks for each test are 50%. Students failing in compulsory subjects will not be promoted / not be allowed for BISE examination. Along side class tests are taken regularly. Class attendance, home assignments, attendance in Science Practical(s), afternoon attendance of Senior Section & mini projects are integral parts of the examinations system.

IDENTITY CARDS:

Every student of the institution is issued an identity card which is non-transferable. Students must keep the identity card and must produce it when demanded by prefects or concerned staff. Duplicate cards are not issued except under special circumstances. A fine of Rs. 200/ is charged for issuance of duplicate ID card.

Transport facility for both male and female students is available However Parents/Guardians can arrange their own transport according to their convenience.



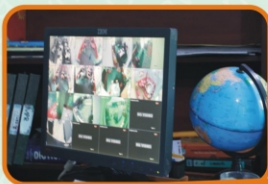
DISPENSARY

SECURITY

A safe and secure environment is a prerequisite for effective teaching and learning. To ensure security, there are trained people patrolling on Entrance gates, Hence, every corner of DAWN School & College System Swat, is targeted/focused with highly CCTV Cameras system and it is under observation by monitoring team in every campus of DAWN. .



FINES RULES

- I) **Fee Fine:** Special fine on fee deposition after the due date is charged at a rate of Rs. 20 per day.
- II) **Fine For Violation of Discipline:** Punishment for late arrivals include attending classes while standing in the classroom, jumps, deliberate exercise, late stays in which extra academic work is given to candidate under all these conditions Parents/Guardians are informed before hand and students are allowed to attend classes until their entry to the institute is stopped and they are sent back to home. However, the habitual late arriving students are warned and fined up to Rs. 100 per late arrival leading to suspension from classes or withdrawal from institute. Habitual late comer means any student who comes to college late for 3 days during any month. such a student's name is registered/recorded in the Habitual late comers Register and is fined up to Rs. 100 per late arrival. When a habitual late comer has no late arrival in a month his name is removed from habitual late comers register. The Parents/Guardians of habitual late comers may be contacted in this regard.
- III) A fine of Rs. 50 per day will be charged on students who remain absent without any valid reason/application for leave, or he will have to compensate the absentia by showing presence in afternoon session for at least three hours.
- IV) In case of absentia, excuses from Monthly Tests, Enrichment Tests Assignments, surprise tests or Term/Board Warmup Examinations/Pre-Board Exams without any cogent reason, the student is liable to fine of Rs. 200 per paper at S.S.C level and Rs. 300 per paper at F.Sc level or to be struck off and even expelled from college roll. Readmission will be granted only after the approval of concerned Class Teacher and Principal with special fine of Rs. 800. Besides, the concerned Parents/Guardians must submit an undertaking for further regularity of his/her son/ward onwards by physically visiting the institute. At S.S.C level and Rs. 150 per paper at F.Sc level or to be struck off and even expelled from college roll. Readmission will be granted only after the approval of concerned Class Teacher and Principal with special fine of Rs. 500. Besides, the concerned Parents/Guardians must submit an undertaking for further regularity of his/her son/ward onwards by physically visiting the relevant campus.





HOSTELS

Dawn Hostels separate for Boys and Girls are equipped with all the facilities required by students to make them feel at home. We strive to provide scholarly, peaceful and conducive environment for students. Great emphasis is laid on developing good and healthy habits in students, which are necessary for having a planned and disciplined professional life and discourage bad habits which may harm their mental and/or physical growth/development.

Dawn Hostels provides full proof security with security staff that is present at the gate 24/7. Separate section is allotted to the students of junior level where special care is taken according to their needs and are paid special attention. Dars-e-Quran takes place on regular basis where religious scholars are invited to give sermons on special occasions.
